

NOTICE OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS



Date: June 7, 2021

This notice is to advise you that the **City of Alhambra** has awarded a contract to **Sully Miller** for the construction of the FY19-20 SB1 Street Rehabilitation Project. This project will consist of pavement rehabilitation (including removal and reconstruction, milling, slurry seal, etc.) and concrete improvements (i.e., sidewalks and curb & gutter, ADA ramps) on the residential streets shown in the map below. In order to safely construct these new improvements, traffic control will be implemented when and where needed, which may include temporary street closures and restricted parking. This notice is to make you aware of the upcoming scheduled repairs in your street and other nearby streets.

WHEN: June 2021 – September 2021.

Construction will be completed in two general phases:

PHASE 1: Concrete improvements which include broken and off-grade sidewalk, broken and off-grade curb & gutter, upgrades of ADA ramps, broken and off-grade cross gutters, off-grade driveway apron repairs. Temporary no Parking signs will be posted at the locations where work will be done and room is necessary for contractor to access the work area.

PHASE 2: Removal and reconstruction of pavement, grind-overlay of AC pavement, and slurry seal.

We thank you for your cooperation during construction and assure you we will move through the project as efficiently as possible to minimize any inconvenience.

****Frequently Asked Questions****

Q. Will I get a ticket if I park in the street overnight during time of construction?

A. Overnight street parking enforcement will be relaxed during construction; you may park in the street overnight during construction.

Q. Will trash still be collected during construction?

A. YES. Sully Miller, the City of Alhambra and Republic Services are working together to ensure your services are not interrupted.

Q. When will I know when work will be done on my street?

A. Secondary notice. A secondary notice will be distributed to let you know a more specific schedule of when the next phase of construction will be affecting your street.

Q. Will street closures remain throughout the week?

A. Closures will only remain intact **during** construction. At the end of every day, the contractor will remove any road closure signs, barricades or detours until the following morning. Working hours are Monday – Friday, 7am – 5pm (excluding holidays)

Q. Why is my neighbor's sidewalk, curb & gutter, or driveway apron being replaced and mine isn't?

A. Cracked sidewalks, curb & gutters, or driveway aprons will not alone make for a replacement candidate. Repairs are not for aesthetic purposes but for functionality and safety of the public. The City uses specific criteria listed below to select which locations to repair. NOTE: If a driveway has been widened within private property and the new apron is more narrow than the new driveway, the City will NOT upgrade the apron.

- Low point or uplifted gutter impeding the flow of water and therefore causing damage to the asphalt on the road.
- Uplifts causing issues for pedestrian paths (sidewalks and ADA ramps are pedestrian path).
